We have had such a fabulous term with so many wonderful experiences for the children.

Year R have been hooked into their topic with the farm visit in week 1. They were left some chicken eggs which they have been nurturing and looking after so carefully in their incubators. Meet our chicks over the page. They have been learning how to write a list and using their sounds to write about the animals that live on a farm.

Year 1 have been experiencing what it was like for a child to live in Victorian times. They had a fabulous visit to Manor farm where they gained in-depth knowledge on how children went to school and life in a Victorian home. We have seen some amazing writing on wash day and the children loved coming into school dressed as Victorian children. Thank you for coming to their celebration assembly.

Year 2 were hooked into their topic with a drama based theme for the Great Fire of London. They are absolutely fascinated with the facts of this historical event. The children have then been using these facts to have some really good philosophy lessons. Look out for their celebration event coming soon.

We are pleased to inform you that work to resurface our playground play apparatus will begin soon. This has been made possible because the government has continued the PE and sports funding to schools this year, and we have been able to use this ring-fenced funding to improve this area. This will mean that this top area of the playground will be restricted for at least two weeks, possibly three. We are very much looking forward to having a purpose built warm up zone for physical activity for our children. This developed area will enable sustained physical activity for our children for many years to come. We will be able to use this area to warm up before PE lessons and enable physical activity during playtimes. The children can use the solar timer to beat their records going around the course.
