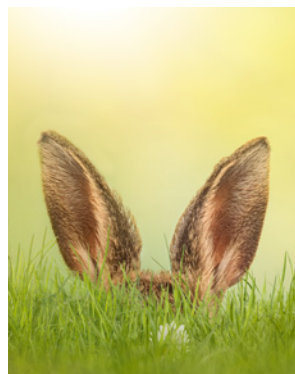

ELIZABETH BLACKADDER
29 MARCH – 12 JUNE
WILLIS MUSEUM, BASINGSTOKE

Dame Elizabeth Blackadder is one of our greatest artists: the first woman to be elected both to the Royal Scottish Academy and the Royal Academy, she was given the prestigious title of Her Majesty's Painter and Limner in Scotland in 2001. This specially curated exhibition, drawn mainly from the artist's studio, will show the breadth and variety of Blackadder's work and aims to reveal and celebrate an exceptional career.

As well as daily family activities during the Easter holidays, there will be bookable family watercolour workshops on Tuesday 16 and Wednesday 17 April, led by artist Isabel Hurley. Visit the Elizabeth Blackadder exhibition with Isabel and be inspired, before exploring your own ideas with her expert guidance. All child participants will receive their own tin of 12 watercolour paints to take home.
