# Our E-Safety Vision

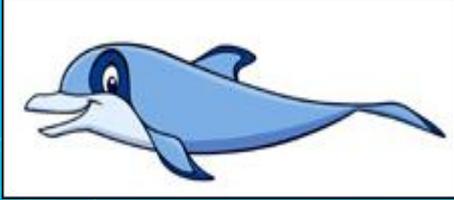

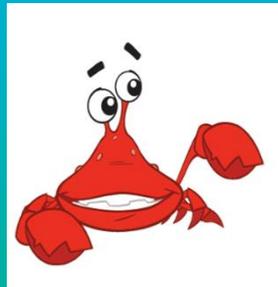

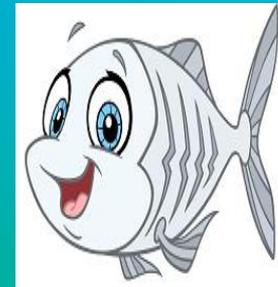

I will not open an e-mail unless I know who has sent it.

straight away.

I know that my use of ICT will be checked by grown-ups  
to make sure I am safe.
