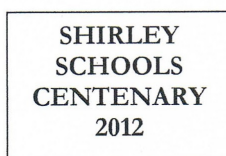

old – the Shirley schools had a very good reputation for results in
the city so we were constantly prepared/ trained for good outcomes

We were seated in order of outcome, having marks for each of the
subjects above and an overall combined mark. The brightest sat in
the back row and those girls needing more help were in the front, so
we were moved according to marks.
Although in the same building as Shirley Junior Boys –we never
'worked' together or even saw the boys !!They resided on the top
floor and used the Wilton Road play ground –we [the girls] were in
the Bellemoor Road playground with the Infants.
All in all happy times
