

Year R Autumn Term 2 Curriculum Newsletter

8th November 2019

Dear Parents / Guardians,

Thank you very much for supporting us in settling your children. It has been lovely to see them starting their school journey with such confidence and independence. During this half term we will continue to reinforce the school routines and build on the children's confidence within the setting and making new friends.

Our first topic this half term is 'Once Long Ago'. During this topic we will be looking at different types of castles and thinking about the characters that live in them. We will be doing lots of role play and creating stories. We will be learning our very own 'Three Little Princesses' story and sequencing it too. We would urge you to share as many different stories with your child at home to help them come up with their own exciting story ideas.



Our last topic of the Autumn Term is 'Christmas', where we will learn about the Christmas Story. We are very excited about all the festive activities, including our whole school Christmas Production.



In our daily phonic sessions we are learning letter sounds and the formation of each letter shape. We will continue to send home letter flash cards for you to practise at home. Alongside sound recognition, we will also teach them how to put letters together to read simple words (blending). We will send a list of words home after your child has learnt a few sounds. The first list of words will be given to you at parents evening to give you some suggestions of words your child can try and blend. As well as all of this practise we will be learning new tricky words too, these are those words that can't be sounded out and new to be learnt by sight. We will continue to send these home as flash cards as we learn them. Please practise letter sounds and tricky words little and often...it all helps!

In maths we will continue to practice our 1:1 correspondence for accurate counting. We will be teaching the children the concepts of more and less and how to use equipment to solve simple problems. We will also continue to recognise numbers by sight and begin to become confident recognising those tricky teen numbers- this would be a great thing to help your child with at home... so get those number rhymes ready!!



The children are particularly enjoying our M.O.O.T (Managing Our Own Time) sessions, which encourage them to use their new learning environment with greater confidence and develop their independence skills, problem solving, cooperation and creativity. M.O.O.T takes place four times a week and allows the children to plan and undertake their own learning from a wide range of activities available. The challenges within the learning areas are linked to our current topic.

A small request from us is that your child is in school ready to start at **8:55**. The doors and gate will be closed promptly at this time to enable us to begin our daily routines more smoothly. Please ensure, for the safety and security of your children, that if the small Reception gates/ classroom doors are closed that you take your child to the main office. The office staff will then register your child and bring them through to their class.

We would also really appreciate it if your child has a coat in school at **ALL** times as we use our outdoor classroom in all weathers and therefore we really need the children to have the correct clothing. Please also remember to provide a P.E. kit if you have not already done so. As always, please remember if you have any concerns or queries, please do speak to your child's class teacher.
