This will feel a bit funny, but at least we will all have plenty of space around us. We can say hello with a virtual high five!




OUR CLASSROOM

NEW THINGS TO LEARN

AT THE END OF THE DAY


When it is nearly home time we will make sure our special basket and our desk is clean and tidy ready for the next day.
