

## Keeping our children safe online at Shirley Infant School



The school uses 2 layers of protection. Firstly, Smoothwall is our content filter. This is highly effective at removing the vast majority of unpleasant or inappropriate sites. Secondly, we use Senso to log keywords and allow live monitoring of student use across the classroom. There is no perfect system (although ours is very good) as the

internet is evolving minute by minute and over blocking can lead to false positives that prevent and disrupt learning. We encourage the children to reflect on how they behave online and encourage responsibility in E-safety lessons and through whole school assemblies..

# Deciding what's appropriate for children to see online

The online world gives us access to a huge amount of information and services, but the scale of information available also means that there is content that is inappropriate for children. What is or isn't appropriate is up to individual parents and carers to decide, and could be based on things like age, ability, beliefs and family values.

## What are parental controls?

Parental controls allow you to block and filter upsetting or inappropriate content. They work across your WiFi, phone network, individual apps and devices. Parental controls can help you to:

- plan what time of day your child can go online and how long for
- create content filters to block apps that may have [inappropriate content](#)
- manage the content different family members can see.



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## Useful information

### **Set up parental controls on Google Play:**

1. Open the Google Play app .
2. At the top right, tap the profile icon.
3. Tap Settings Family. ...
4. Turn on Parental controls.
5. To protect parental controls, create a PIN that your child doesn't know.
6. Select the type of content that you want to filter.
7. Choose how to filter or restrict access.
