### Who is coming to tea?

Challenge your child to set up the picnic blanket or table for the teddy bears. Explain there are 4 bears coming to tea (you can change the number each time). What do we need?

- $\Rightarrow$  Plates x 4
- ⇒ blanket
- $\Rightarrow$  Cups x 4
- $\Rightarrow$  Bowl x 4
- ⇒ Teapot or jug
- ⇒ Knives, forks and spoons x 4 each
- ⇒ Sugar pot and milk pot

Encourage your child to set out a place for each teddy with one of each of the items.

What happens to the amount of items if there are less teddies? What happens to the amount if there are more teddies?

## **Counting**

Challenge your little one to count out how many teddy bears have come to your picnic. Can they write or stick the correct number on the board for how many have come to tea?

- ⇒ Chalk board or paper
- ⇒ Chalk or pen
- ⇒ Number cards
- ⇒ Fingers





Encourage your child to hold up the correct number of fingers for how many teddy's are at their picnic.

Can you sort all the small teddies together?

#### **Pretend lunch**

Collect natural materials from your garden or role play food for the teddy bears to eat.

Can you make a cheese sandwich with two leaves and daisy's for the filling? What else can you make?
