Key Information considered to inform planning: 17-20

Incorporated into planning due to local and national data from Public Health England:

Children in low income families (under 16) is still significantly worse than England average - Cate Gregory leads on EPP.

Sex and Relationships (SRE) provision within curriculum to support local data of under 18 conceptions. In 2016 the local count of pregnancies under 18 was significantly worse than England national average. Newly sexually transmitted infections local value is 1,123.8 compared to 793.8 national value. Children are taught at age appropriate levels about the transmission of germs. There are posters about washing hands displayed in all bathrooms and classrooms. Learning about the transmission of germs provides foundations to build onto for children to learn about sexually transmitted infections later in their education.

Continue with healthy schools practise, embedded PE lessons, golden mile, active and healthy week as obsess children aged 10-11 is now not significantly different from the England average (2018 data) compared to 2016 data that showed Southampton as significantly worse than England average.

Hospital stays for self-harm are significantly worse than England average with the local value at 348.1 compared to the national value at 185.3. Right Respecting language has changed to Rights Respecting Actions. The Rights of A Child include the right to be safe and children are taught about respectful actions towards themselves and others.
