
INFANTS & JUNIORS COVID UPDATE

Parent COVID Guidance – March 2022

We recognise the Government guidance has change but we would like to ask our parents and staff to continue to follow the recommended guidance in order to protect our community.

Anyone who develops 1 of the 3 main COVID-19 symptoms it is recommended that they stay at home and self-isolate and take a PCR test. They self-isolate if they get a positive test result for a minimum of 6 days, even if they have had a recent negative lateral flow test

Examples of when to end self-isolation if you have had COVID-19 symptoms or have received a positive COVID-19 test result



Lateral flow tests are taken by people who do not have COVID-19 symptoms.

If you choose to continue to use LF tests and your child tests positive, we recommend they isolate for at least 6 days

Other measures: The schools will continue to have a focus on hygiene and cleaning. It is no longer required that staff wear masks but they may do if they wish.





Bluestar helps ease fuel pump costs with half price weekly ticket

Bluestar are offering local car drivers the chance to try its services for half the cost of regular, weekly tickets via app until **4 April 2022.** This gives drivers the chance to avoid rising fuel costs by switching to the bus.

As fuel prices are creeping towards £2 per litre, many road users are reconsidering their travel options. Local bus operator, Bluestar is encouraging everyone to embrace going green by using public transport. Bluestar buses use low emission Euro 6 engines and one full double decker bus

If you choose to travel by bus, for your first week Bluestar are offering a standard seven-day ticket for half price, costing you just £5 when using the Bluestar app for the first time. This will allow you to travel in any zone as often as you like.

The Highway Code: update to rules on using mobile phones

From today (25 March), rules in The Highway Code are coming into force to make any hand-held use of a mobile phone while driving illegal, except in limited circumstances.

The changes were supported by 80% of respondents in a public consultation in 2021.

This means you must not use a device in your hand for any reason, whether online or offline. The law applies to you if you're:

- supervising a learner driver
- stopped at traffic lights
- queuing in traffic
- driving a car that turns the engine off when you stop moving
- holding and using a device that's offline or in flight mode

There are exceptions, such as if you need to call 999 or 112 in an emergency or making a contactless payment in a vehicle that is not moving.

You can find the full rules on using a phone, sat nav or another device when driving on GOV.UK

The government's award-winning THINK! team will launch an <u>awareness</u> <u>campaign</u> today to remind drivers not to use a hand-held phone at the wheel and the penalties of choosing to ignore this new law.

Why staying up to date is important

It's important that everyone – not just learner drivers – understand their responsibility for the safety of other road users.

Many of the rules in the code are legal requirements, and if you disobey these rules you're committing a criminal offence.

If you do not follow the other rules in the code, it can be used in evidence in court proceedings to establish liability.
