### Messages Contd .....

A reminder to all parents/carers that drop children off by car. Please avoid dropping off on Wilton Road, (Winchester Road entrance). This can be extremely hazardous as children don't often think of this section as a road and cross without thought, often ahead of parents. There are plenty of parking options just a few minutes walk away.

We have also seen a big increase in the amount of vehicles being parked there. We remind you that this is our only entrance for emergency vehicles and if they need to get through they will not be able to whilst you are parked there. Please consider the seriousness of keeping this clear and that the children's safety is paramount.

The children recently had a visit from the Police who advised the school that they were unhappy with the situation regarding parking over the emergency exit and have asked us to do all we can to stop the parking there.

We are able to use the car park at The Range and you can use the car park outside Pets At Home as long as you adhere to the parking rules regarding length of stay and duration before return.



There have been recent localised outbreaks of measles centred around the West Midlands. There is a risk of further outbreaks in other areas unless urgent action is taken to increase Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccination take up in areas with low MMR vaccine rates.

Measles spreads very easily among those who are unvaccinated, especially in nurseries and schools. The best protection against measles for children and adults is to get both doses of the MMR vaccine. It is never too late to have these vaccinations.
