KEEPING US INFORMED

UPDATE FROM PUBLIC HEALTH ENGLAND

As an extra precaution Public Health England (PHE) is now advising close contact of anyone with a positive test result to get a COVID-19 PCR test (ideally 5 days after exposure or day five of isolation). If your child has had a positive PCR test within the last 90 days, you do not need to get another test unless they have new symptoms.

£1 travel after 6pm on Southampton's buses this summer

From now until September, both Bluestar and City Red are offering an evening fare of just £1 per journey on all their city centre routes after 6pm. Along with our introduction of free evening and Sunday parking, this is another great excuse to come and enjoy everything the city has to offer this summer.

The Bluestar £1 fare is valid from 6pm for all journeys within its Southampton or city zone. And City Red are offering the £1 single fare on all City Red buses in its Southampton zone, including the Solent Ranger X4/X5. You can see the City Red Southampton ticket zones on its 'Southampton Ticket Zones' map.
