## Year 1 Parents

This week we are going to focus on recount writing. This is a piece of writing that explains in detail an event that has happened. The writing needs to be past tense and the children can focus on using time connectives to ensure their writing is in the right order. These include First, Next, After, Then, Finally, In the morning, After lunch etc. To ensure their writing is interesting for the reader they could also focus on using interesting adjectives to describe their day. The activities below will help the children use the skills to write a successful recount.

## Activity 1

Oh no! Miss Ruck has written a recount but she has put her statements in the wrong order! Can you help her put them back in the riaht order? You could either cut and stick them in vour home learnina book or number them in the correct order.
