Parents...

We have taught the children letters can be pronounced differently. Please focus on the different ways to pronounce ow - *cow* and *blow*. When reading new words, we encourage the children to try out both ways to see which makes a real word. There are some suggested activities below for your child to complete.



How many words can you eye spy which have the -ow spelling pattern? Can you spell the words correctly?






Activity 4
