The Lazy Giant by Ivan Jones

In this book, the children will be using the reading skill: retrieval.

<u>Key words:</u> **lazy** – doesn't want to work **cottage** – a small house **choppy** – jerky or rough **quake** – shake, shiver

Questions:

- Look together at the cover image.
 Who do you think the man in the picture is? What are the children doing?
- Read the blurb together.
 What do you think might happen in the story? Why do you think this?
- Turn to page 5. Look at the image at the top of the page. What sort of person do you think the Giant is? Why?
- Pause at the end of page 9.
 What went wrong with the breakfast? What do you think will happen next?
- Pause at the end of page 30.
 How do you feel about the Giant now? What do you think the Giant might do next?

Additional questions once the children have read:

- How did the children in the story feel about the Giant? What tells you that?
- What sort of work did the children in the story do for the Giant? What happened if the Giant was not pleased?
- When the Giant went out in his carriage, what made him angry? What did he do that upset the children?

Challenge:

- Page 24 What do you think the children are whispering to each other?
- Do you think the Giant has learned his lesson? Why?
