

Parents... When comparing two nouns, we have taught the children to add —er to the adjective. E.g. **Tom is smaller than Tara.** When comparing 3 or more nouns, we have taught the children to add — est to the adjective. E.g. **Tom is the smallest in the group.** (Remember nouns are people, places and objects).
