Activity 2

Please can you read through the features of instructions with your child and they can then circle the features found on the example below.

Instruction writing features.

- Use bossy verbs (place, cut, put).
- Use time conjunctions (first, next, after, finally).
- Write each instruction on a new line.
- Connecting conjunctions (and, however, but).

How To Make Fruit Pizzas

You will need:

- Digestive biscuits
- Natural yoghurt
- 3 4 different types of fruit e.g. Apple, banana, grapes, orange
- Plate
- Spreading knife
- Sharp knife
- A grown up!

What to do:

- First, place your biscuits on the plate.
- Then, spread the yogurt onto the biscuit.
- Carefully cut up the fruit into small pieces. (Ask a grown up to help you with the sharp knife)
- · Finally, put the fruit on top of the yogurt.
- Enjoy!



Keep the fruit pizzas in the fridge once made.

- Water







You will need:

- 1 large cereal box

- · Thin strip of blue paper
- · 4 bottle tops
- · Red and yellow paint to decorate
- 4 round lids
- Scrunched up newspaper
- Grey paint Black paint
- Sticky tope





How to Catch an Alien

Do you need to capture a pesky alien living in your garden? Use these instructions to help you!

You Will Need:

- A pair of unused underpants
 A rope
- A stick
- · A large cardboard box without a lid
- · A big fishing net



- Make a small hole in the top of the box.
- 2.) Push the rope through the hole.
- 3.) Tie the rope in a knot.
- 4.) Put the box outside.
- 5.) Use the stick to prop up the box.
- Place the underpants underneath the box.
- Pick up the end of the rope.
