This week the children have the opportunity to do some creative writing. This type of work really excites children and inspires them to be as creative as they'd like to be! The first part of this work will focus on reminding children of the skills needed to write successful sentences.

We have had a few questions about correcting spellings. The children are never expected to know all spellings. We expect them to know common exception words and you can encourage them to check these if they are incorrect. Please see the document attached to this week's home learning. Otherwise, the children should just be making phonetically plausible attempts to spell. E.g. Train / Trayn – The digraph 'ay' is a phonetically plausible way to spell train but we would ask them if they think trayn looks right!
