<u>Year 2</u> Suffixes - less -ful

Suffixes are letters that you add on to the end of words to change their meanings. Most words you can just add -less and -ful to.

The suffix -**ful** means 'full of' or 'lots of' (e.g. pain**ful** - full of pain or lots of pain) The suffix -**less** means 'without' (e.g. pain**less** - without pain)

If a root word ends in a -y, drop the y and add an i (e.g. beauty - beautiful)
