Can you find all the words that tell you how Tiger was feeling? What about how he moved? Why did the author use the words 'Tiger had to move... fast!'

• Read to Page 13

Look at all the words that the author uses when Tiger speaks. 'Cried' 'groaned' and 'said'. Why do you think the different words were used? Does it change the way you read the sentence if one of those words is added?

• Page 13


Can you think of any other words that could be used instead of 'Splosh!' to describe what happens when Tiger falls into the cup?
