# Discuss the features of a Non-fiction book

Contents page, index, photographs, labels, diagrams, captions. Can you find these features in the book? Encourage your child to flick through the book and find them.

#### Questions:

- Look at the front cover.
   Read the word patterns.
   What are patterns?
   What do you think this book might be about?
- Read up to page 5.
   What is the little boy climbing on? What does the book tell us is it similar to?
- Before your child reads page 6.
   Why do you think a butterfly might be in the book? Have a look at the picture to help you.
   Read page 6 and see if you are right.
- Read up to page 9.

  What are the bees making? Point to where the answer is. Did you know this already without the help of the book?
- Read up to page 11.
  What kind of car is driving down the road? Point to the word that tells us the answer.
- Read up to page 13.
   What had made the pattern on the sand?
- Read up to page 14.
   What is the pattern on here? Use the picture and the words to help you.

## Extra ideas-

- Can you research patterns on the internet? What patterns can you find that are not in the book?
- Write your own Non-Fiction book about something that you know a lot about. Don't forget to include a Contents page, page numbers, pictures, labels, index and lots of facts!
- Make a poster about one of the favourite patterns from the book. You could include a caption and labels.
