

Inference Questions with Inference Iggy

Inference Iggy will help you hunt for clues in a text about how someone might be feeling or why something is happening. Prediction Questions with Predicting Pip

Predicting Pip tries to see the future and she will help you work out what might happen next.



Prediction

- Look at the front cover and ask your child to predict what they think might happen in the story. Use clues from the picture and the title.
- Read the blurb. Does this change their prediction about the story?
- Read the book together. Stop at important parts of the story and ask your child to discuss what has just happened and what they predict will happen next. Once you have read on reflect back on whether their prediction was correct.
- Ask your child to write their own ending to the story as the next book.

Pause at the end page 4.

- Why is Tiger patting himself down?
- Why does Tiger then frown? How is he feeling?
- How does Ant feel about the situation?

Pause at page 11.

- Why are they worried about it getting even hotter?
- Why do you think the plant was protecting itself?
- Why do you think they need shelter?

Pause at page 16.

- How do you think Ant, Tiger and Seven feel now they are trapped?
- Why do you think the aliens have trapped them?

Pause at page 32.

- How do you think Ant and Tiger feel leaving seven behind?
- Why do you think Ant is grinning?
- Why does Tiger say they'll be no match for all of us? What does this mean?
