
Task - Creating your own family tree

Look at pictures of your family. Can you begin to make sense of your own life-story and your own family history? What is the same? What is different? Who was born before you? Who was born after you?

Can you create a family tree using photographs of your family? Can you label it? If you fancy a challenge, can you write a short description for one or two family members e.g. My Mum is tall and has brown hair. I love her because she gives the best hugs.

Task - Looking at toys of the past and present

Talk to a grown-up about favourite toys. This could be your grandparents, your auntie, your uncle, your parents or even your next-door neighbour! Tell them about your favourite toy and find out about their favourite toys that they played with when they were your age. Do they still have them? What is the same? What is different?







Task - Pictures of the past

Look through some photos of special events that you and your family have shared since you were born. Can you remember any of these events? Talk to a grown-up about what you remember about each photo.

<u>Task - Where do I live?</u>

Ask a grown-up to help you find some old photos of where you live. What still looks the same? What has changed?
