
Parents

The children have learnt how to use a full stop, question mark and exclamation mark. This first page can be used as a teaching page to remind children of what each punctuation mark is used for. We use kung fu punctuation to remind children what their mark will look like at the end of the sentence. Ask your child to show the punctuation mark with the kung fu action!



Can you identify these three punctuation marks?

All of them are used to finish sentences.

Full stop

This is the way sentences usually ends. As long as the sentence is not asking a question or expressing a strong feeling or emotion, it will end in a full stop.

The dog ran home.

I enjoyed an ice lolly.

Question Mark

A question mark ends a sentence that is a question.

What is your name? How old are you?

Exclamation Mark

An exclamation mark ends a sentence that shows a strong feeling like surprise or anger. You can also use them to show someone is shouting.

Hey! Stop it!

BANG!






